CAMPAIGN TIMELINE: 2008-09

July 3 rd 2008	Habib ‘Paps’ Ullah died on Thursday 3 rd July during a stop and search by Police Officers on a vehicle in a car park in High Wycombe at approximately 7.15pm.
July 4 th	Initial autopsy carried out by Thames Valley Police without IPCC being notified
July 9 th	Habib’s Funeral in Slough
July 11 th	First vigil outside High Wycombe Police Station
July 12 th	Second vigil in Frogmoor/High Wycombe Town Centre
July	Campaign for Justice for Habib ‘Paps’ Ullah set up
July	Facebook Group set up for campaign*
	First vigils/protest videos go up on You Tube**
July 22 nd	First interim investigative update on Habib’s death published by IPCC
August	Justice4Paps website set up with support from 4WardEver***
August 1 st	Public meeting at Green St Youth & Community Centre
August 5 th	First meeting with IPCC
August 9 th	March & rally from Green St to Town Centre with approximately 120 people attending.

August 25 th	Campaign interview with BBC Three Counties radio Press conference at Ambassador Court Hotel, High Wycombe
September	Five officers at the scene of Habib's death now under investigation First campaign newsletter released
September 26 th	<i>Iftari</i> /breaking fast meal at Totteridge Mosque
October 25 th	Family and campaign members attend annual Family & Friends Remembrance Procession in Central London with other families who have lost loved ones in custody.
November 13 th	Campaign attend vigil for Sean Rigg outside Brixton Police Station.
December 3 rd	Six month candle-lit vigil outside High Wycombe Police St. Public meeting at Bucks New University
December 20 th	Habib's children, family & campaign members and present a birthday card to Officers at High Wycombe Police Station to mark what would have been his 40 th birthday.
January 2009	Final post-mortem/pathologist report released Family/Campaign produces critical commentary on this
March 6 th	Second meeting with IPCC
March 22 nd	Marcus Cottoy, a 31 African-Caribbean man dies in suspicious circumstances after being released from Amersham Police Station, High Wycombe
