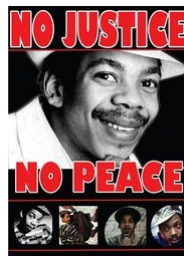

'HABIB FAMILY STILL FIGHTING FOR JUSTICE'

On July 3rd 2008 Habib 'Paps' Ullah died during a stop and search by Police Officers on a vehicle in a car park in High Wycombe at approximately 7.15pm.

Three years later and the family are still searching for answers, having gone to the High Court and having had an inquest abandoned. Please support the family and the campaign that has been running and support all the other families who have experienced a death in custody. Since Pap's death in 2008 there have been other high profile deaths at the hands of the police such as Sean Rigg in Brixton and the Ian Tomlinson in 2009 and most recently Smiley Culture in Surrey. Soon after Pap's death there was another death in High Wycombe – Marcus Cottoy. It comes as no surprise to us that the majority of people who die in custody come from Black and minority communities, and that to date not a single police officer has been successfully prosecuted for a death since 1969 also comes as no surprise. What we do know is that we will not give up for the sake of his children, widow, brother and sisters and Mum. We will not give up because we do not want another family in the Thames Valley area and beyond to go through with what we have gone through.

Every year the family and the campaign have a vigil/ peaceful protest outside High Wycombe Police Station to mark the anniversary/ 'bursee' of his death and on his birthday – 20th of December. Each year family & friends have marked this occasion by lighting candles and a card is given in by his children to the police station and we have had speakers and supporters from around the country.

Please join us on Sunday 3rd July 2011 4-7pm for a vigil/peaceful protest outside High Wycombe Police Station to mark the 3rd Anniversary of his death



CAMPAIGN TIMELINE: 2008-2011

July 3 rd 2008	Habib 'Paps' Ullah died on Thursday 3 rd July during a stop and search by Police Officers on a vehicle in a car park in High Wycombe at approximately 7.15pm.
July 4 th 2008	Initial autopsy carried out by Thames Valley Police without IPCC being notified
July 9 th 2008	Habib's Funeral in Slough
July 10 th & 12 th 2008	First vigil & Second vigil outside High Wycombe Police Station & Frogmoor/Town Centre
July 2008	Campaign for Justice for Habib 'Paps' Ullah & Facebook Group setup for campaign. First vigils/protest videos go up on Youtube.
July 22 nd 2008	First investigative update on Habib's death published by Independent Police Complaints Commission (IPCC)
August 2008	Public meeting at Green St Community Centre
August 5 th 2008	First meeting with IPCC
August 9 th 2008	March & rally from Green St to Town Centre with approximately 120 people attending.
August 25 th 2008	Press conference at Ambassador Court Hotel, High Wycombe
September 26 th 2008	<i>Iftari</i> /breaking fast meal at Totteridge Mosque
October 25 th 2008	Family and campaign members attend annual Family & Friends Remembrance Procession in Central London with other families who have lost loved ones in custody.
November 13 th 2008	Campaign attend vigil for Sean Rigg outside Brixton Police St.
December 3 rd 2008	Six month candle-lit vigil outside High Wycombe Police St. & Public meeting at Bucks New University
December 20 th 2008	Habib's children, family & campaign members and present a card to Officers at High Wycombe Police Station to mark what would have been his 40 th birthday.
January 2009	Final post-mortem/pathologist report released.
March 6 th 2009	Second meeting with IPCC
March 22 nd 2009	Marcus Cottoy, an African-Caribbean local man dies in suspicious circumstances after being released from Amersham Police St.

May 2009	Campaign attend launch of Green Street Community Association & speak at launch of the United Campaign Against Police Violence in London
June 2009	Campaign receives an apology from Thames Valley Police regarding their 'insensitive' communication
July 3 rd 2009	First Anniversary Vigil for Habib outside HW Police St.
July 2009	Times article published on Habib's death and campaign attended picket of IPCC offices in Holburn.
August 2009	Campaign attend and speak at first anniversary Vigil for Sean Rigg outside Brixton Police Station
October 2009	Campaign attend House of Lords in support of Azelle Rodney
Nov 2009	Third meeting with IPCC.
November 2009	Campaign attend inquest for Mikey Powell in Brum
Dec 2009	Family & campaign hold a candle-lit vigil outside High Wycombe Police Station on his 41 st birthday.
March 2010	IPCC report into the circumstances surrounding the death of Habib Ullah is published.
May 15 th 2010	Justice event with 4WardEver, Mikey Powell Campaign and Leicester Civil Rights Movement.
July 3 rd 2010	Second Anniversary Vigil for Habib outside HW Police Station with supporters from Sean Rigg campaign and NMP.
Oct 30 th 2010	Family and campaign members attend United Family & Friends Remembrance Procession in Central London.
December 6-13 th	Inquest into Habib's death takes place in Iver, Bucks but this is abandoned after the first week due to revelations that Officers statements had been changed
January 3 rd 2011	Family & campaign hold a candle-lit vigil outside HW Police Station on what would have been his 42 nd birthday.
April 7 th 2011	Family meet with CPS to look at the case and possible criminal proceedings against the Police officers involved.
April 16 th 2011	Family & campaign attend Smiley Culture demonstration in London and give their support to the campaign.
